Support for the therapist

Risks to the client

- Self-harm
- Disclosure of information
- Feeling worse
- Disappointment
- Change!
- Reliability

Risks to others

- Harm from the client
- Harm from other people
- Relationships affected

Risks to the counsellor

- Harm from the client
- Harm from others
- Complaint
- Claim
- Summons
- Burnout

Risks to the therapy

- Counsellor issues / c'transference
- Blurred boundaries
- Edge of awareness
- Inappropriate referral
- Disclosure / loss of trust

Risks to the profession

- Misconduct
- Malpractice
- Disrepute

Useful questions to ask:

- Who is at risk?
- Whose responsibility?
- Which ethical principles?

Scenario: Client expressing suicidal ideation; unhappy relationship; you've been approached by the police to give your opinion on whether the client is sufficiently safe and mentally stable to have his gun licence renewed.
