- Have been working with survivors for over 30 years
- See 150 female clients per week for specialist therapy
- Offer specialist play therapy to girls aged 4+
- Receive between 250 to 350 helpline calls per week
- Trained 2700 education and health professionals last year
- Supported script writers in developing programmes dealing with all forms of sexual violence
- Offer a women only space for female clients who have experienced sexual violence

Reasons for being here

- Sexual Violence is often misunderstood by society, including therapists
- Many clients come to us saying that they have found their therapists find it difficult to engage with the sexual violence they have experienced
- Occasionally we hear about therapeutic interventions which are based on lack of knowledge about sexual violence

Violence against Women and Girls (VAWG)

'Any act of gender-based violence that results in, or is likely to result in, physical, sexual, or psychological harm or suffering to women,

including threats of such acts, coercion or arbitrary deprivation of liberty, whether occurring in public or in private life.'

Sexual Violence

"Any sexual act, attempt to obtain a sexual act, unwanted sexual comments or advances, or acts to traffic, or otherwise directed, against a person's sexuality using coercion, by any person regardless of their relationship, in any setting, including but not limited to home and work."

"Sexual violence and abuse is any behaviour of a sexual nature which is unwanted and takes place without consent or understanding."



Rape Myths

Women lead the rapist on by what they wear and how they act rape is the result of a misunderstanding Rape is being jumped on by a stranger in a dark alley Men aren't to blame for rape If you're drunk it's your fault Rape is an accusation easy to make but hard to prove Women say no when they mean yes Women lie about rape

Rape Myths

Men can't be raped only gay men get raped only gay men rape other men he had an erection so he wanted/like it Men are less/more affected 'Real' men don't get raped



Childhood Sexual Abuse Myths

Perpetrators are strangers in a dark coat in the playground Children always tell if they're being abused boys who are abused will grow up to be abusers it has to involve penetration to be sexual abuse Children lie about sexual abuse





Why myths matter

- Excuse perpetrators
- Silence survivors

I am terrified by the prospect of being raped (or of being raped again).



As part of this fear I cannot believe that the rape was unprovoked. I need to believe that people who are raped are in control and somehow bring it on themselves.

It was my fault I was raped.



If I can believe that I in some way precipitated the violence then I can believe that I can be in control of my own life - which means I won't get raped in the future.



I protect myself from the idea of being raped (again) by emphasising how much control people who are raped have over events.

What is the legal definition of rape?

Legal Definition of Rape

Penile penetration of the vagina, anus or mouth without a reasonable belief in consent is rape.

What is the legal definition of consent?

CONSENT

Consent is defined as agreeing by choice, and having the freedom and capacity to make that choice.

Children under 13 cannot give consent
